**Further conditions of admission to joint master
study program taught in English at the Faculty of
Informatics and Information Technologies of the
Slovak University of Technology in Bratislava and
the Faculty of Electrical Engineering and
Informatics Technical University of Košice for the
academic year 2026/2027**

Article 1

Introductory provisions

Further conditions of admission to the joint Master's study programme taught in English (hereinafter referred to as "Master's studies"), **provided jointly by** the Faculty of Informatics and Information Technologies of the Slovak University of Technology in Bratislava (hereinafter referred to as "FIIT STU") **and** the Faculty of Electrical Engineering and Informatics of the Technical University of Košice (hereinafter referred to as "FEI TUKE"), for the academic year 2026/2027 (hereinafter referred to as "Further conditions of admission"), are established in accordance with Section 57(1)(h) of Act No. 131/2002 Coll. (hereinafter referred to as the "Act"), Internal Regulation of the Slovak University of Technology in Bratislava No. 5/2013, as amended (hereinafter referred to as the "STU Regulation"), the Statute of FIIT STU (Article 18(1)), the Statute of the Technical University of Košice, and the Statute of the Faculty of Electrical Engineering and Informatics of the Technical University of Košice, Regulation of the Admission procedure of the Technical University of Košice, and the Agreement on the Terms of Cooperation in the Provision of a Joint Degree Programme (hereinafter referred to as the "Agreement"). They further regulate the deadline for submission of applications for Master studies, the method of determining the number of admitted applicants for Master studies, the conditions of admission, the method of verifying their fulfilment and the method of evaluating the results.

Article 2

General principles and considerations for determining the suitability of applicants

(1) The basic condition for admission to Master studies is the successful completion of a study program of the first level¹. Graduates of study programs under previous regulations are also considered as meeting this requirement. For the purposes of this regulation, completion of a combined first- and second-cycle study program shall also be considered as completion of a first-cycle study program.

(2) The professional competence of applicants for Master studies shall be assessed based on the results achieved during first-level tertiary studies, supported by appropriate documents, and/or other achievements demonstrating the professional competence of the applicants as determined by these Further conditions of admission. The assessment shall be carried out by the deciding faculty in cooperation with the other cooperating faculty, in accordance with the Agreement.

(3) Foreign applicants and applicants who have completed first-level higher education abroad shall submit a decision on the recognition of an educational document issued by the relevant regional office in the region of the permanent residence of the applicant or the region of the university location in accordance to Act No. 422/2015 Coll. on the recognition of educational documents and on the recognition of professional qualifications and on the amendments and supplements to certain acts, as amended. Article 3

Organizational principles

(1) An applicant will be included in the admission procedure if he/she delivers an application for studies in electronic form without a guaranteed electronic signature using either the STU Academic Information System (AIS) or the TUKE Academic Information System (MAIS) (hereinafter referred to as the “AIS” and the “electronic application”) by the deadline set by the dean of the deciding faculty. The link for submitting electronic applications shall be published on the website of the deciding faculty no later than two months before the last day for submission of applications.

(2) The applicant shall pay a fee for the material support of the admission procedure². Neither the material fee nor any part of it shall be refunded to the applicant after the deadline for the submission of applications.

(3) The applicant shall provide the following attachments to the application form to the deciding faculty by the date set for the submission of the application form and deliver them to the deciding faculty in paper form before or on the day of enrollment to study at the latest:

a) a proof of English language proficiency at a level of B2 or higher of the CEFR (unless secondary or first-level tertiary education was completed in English),

b) the transcript of completed courses and grades obtained during the entire previous university study confirmed by the faculty or university that issued the certificate and a certified copy of the diploma (if these documents are issued in a language other than Slovak or English, the applicant shall deliver its official translation into Slovak or English or a notarized copy of such translation), a decision on the recognition of the educational document, if the applicant completed their first-level studies at a university outside the Slovak republic and an apostille issued for this educational document

c) the applicant may also provide copies of documents/certificates of significant achievements of his / her professional activity in the study area of informatics and information technologies,

d) candidates with specific needs attach a request to modify the form and manner of the entrance examination. Based on this request and the assessment of their specific needs, the form and the method of the entrance examination shall be determined, considering their specific needs in accordance with internal regulations.

e) a copy of an identity document (ID card or passport); in the case of foreign applicants, a copy of a passport valid for at least six months at the time of enrolment.

(4) In addition to the required attachments pursuant to point (4) of this Article, the applicant shall attach to the application form a confirmation (copy) of payment of the material admission fee pursuant to point (3) of this Article, if he/she has not paid the material admission fee by credit card in the electronic application form in the AIS.

(5) The documents attached to the application form shall not be returned to the applicant but shall remain part of the admission documentation.

(6) Number of applicants who can be admitted to study this joint study program of the Master´s degree is proposed jointly by FIIT STU and FEI TUKE and approved by the Academic Senate of FIIT STU and the Academic Senate of FEI TUKE.

Article 4

Evaluation of the admission procedure

(1) The main aim of the admission procedure for Master studies is to verify the applicant's professional competence to study the chosen study program.

(2) The evaluation of the admission procedure and the proposal of applicants for admission shall be carried out by a committee for the assessment of the professional competence of applicants for master´s studies, appointed by the Dean of the **deciding faculty in cooperation with the partner faculty**, in accordance with the Agreement.

(3) The entrance examination shall be oral, thematically focused on the area of the field of study relevant to the study program pursued. It shall be held before a committee, in person or online, appointed in accordance with point (2) of this Article. It shall have the form of an interview, where the committee shall consider:

- a) the applicant's proven professional knowledge and skills in the field of study concerned,
- b) the applicant's English language ability.

(4) The Committee shall rank the candidates based on the assessment under point (3) of this Article. The selection of applicants proposed for admission shall be based on the ranking of the applicants and the number of applicants the faculty has decided to admit to the relevant study program. The dean may increase the number of admitted candidates by a maximum of 50%.

(5) A record is kept of the outcome of the admission procedure.

Article 5

Decision on the outcome of the admission procedure

(1) The decision on the admission of an applicant shall be made by the Dean of the deciding faculty.

(2) The details of the decision on the result of the admission procedure and its delivery shall be governed by the law and the internal regulations of STU³, the internal regulations of TUKE⁴ and the Agreement.

(3) An applicant may submit a request for a review of the dean's decision within eight days from the date of its delivery. The request shall be submitted to the deciding faculty registry. The procedure for handling

a request for review of the decision on the result of the admission procedure shall be governed by the law and the internal regulation of STU⁵, TUKE⁶ and the Agreement.

(4) An applicant for Master studies who has obtained a score of at least 70 in the admission procedure according to Article 4 (6) shall automatically be admitted to his/her chosen study program.

(5) The dean, in accordance with the capacity of the individual departments providing study programs, may reduce the point threshold for automatic admission to the study referred to in point (4) of this Article. The deciding faculty shall publish this information no later than 10 calendar days before the meeting of the admissions committee.

(6) An applicant for Master studies who has obtained a final score of less than 60 points in the admission procedure according to Article 4 (6) shall not be admitted to the chosen study program due to failure to meet the requirements of the admission procedure.

(7) An applicant for Master studies who cannot provide proof of English language proficiency at the level of at least B2 shall not be admitted to the chosen study program due to failure to meet the requirements of the admission procedure.

(8) The dean may reduce the point threshold referred to in point (6) of this Article in accordance with the capacity of the individual departments providing the study programs. The deciding faculty shall publish this information no later than 10 days before the meeting of the admissions committee.

Article 6

Final provisions

(1) These additional conditions of admission to joint Master studies at FIIT STU and FEI TUKE come into force and affect the date of approval by the Academic Senate of FIIT STU and Academic Senate of FEI TUKE.

(2) Tuition fees for studies in English are determined in accordance with the relevant internal regulations of STU and TUKE and are published on the websites of the respective faculties FIIT STU and FEI TUKE. The Academic Senates of both faculties approved the tuition fee of 7,000 EUR (in words, seven thousand EUR).

(3) Enrolment in studies may be conditioned upon the fulfilment of financial obligations in accordance with the relevant internal regulations of STU and TUKE.

(4) During the study, students are enrolled at both faculties FIIT STU and FEI TUKE. This allows them to access the infrastructure and students supporting services at STU and TUKE.
